RIVERSIDE, Calif. – Justin Scott-Coe, a member of the City of Riverside Board of Public Utilities, will receive the Iron Eyes Cody Award for his environmental stewardship from Keep Riverside Clean and Beautiful Oct. 28.

The award will be given out at the KRCB annual community recognition luncheon at the Benedict Castle, 5446 Chicago Ave.
